

TRUE OR FALSE: MOLES ARE TEARING UP MY YARD, THEREFORE I MUST HAVE A GRUB PROBLEM.



ANSWER: FALSE

For years, the myth that grubs in a lawn create mole problems continues to endure. Yes, moles feed on grub larvae. In fact, they are insectivores, eating most any insect. But, moles crave and prefer earth worms. They may inhabit a relatively grub-free lawn because a majority of their diet consists of earth worms. In fact, earth worms make up 80% of their diet.

Only treat your lawn with grub control if you have experienced grub damage in prior years. Do not apply Merit or other insecticides in an attempt to rid your lawn of moles.
It will not work!
